
Paradigm: No EU Industrial policy:

- weak/absent for international negotiations
- local policies compete with EU policy
- Important financial flows (Ohim, EPO), which can't drop ...
- EPO is not an EU policy leverage (like other patent offices)...


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
Figure 1: A simplified picture of the European patent system



Highlights

This paper provides new evidence about the budgetary consequences

 for patent offices — of the coexistence of the forthcoming Unitary
 Patent (UP) with the current European Patent (EP). Simulation results illustrate a dilemma between (1) high UP renewal fees to ensure enough financial income for all national patent offices (NPOs) and (2) low UP renewal fees to make the UP system affordable, with very few
 NPOs losing on financial revenues. The simulations help to understand the positions of several patent offices, and underline an alternative way to proceed with the negotiations while reducing financial risks for the whole system.
