

**Title:**

CEIPI/WIPO/INPI Advanced Training Course on Intellectual Property, Technology Transfer and Licensing

**Public:**

The Advanced Training Course Intellectual Property, Technology Transfer and Licensing, is jointly organised by the Centre for International Intellectual Property Studies (CEIPI) and the World Intellectual Property Organization (WIPO), with the assistance of the National Institute of Industrial Property (INPI) of France.

The technology transfer professionals to whom the training course is addressed are typically staff members of:

- specialised departments of research and development centres and university laboratories;
- public organisations of technology transfer;
- national intellectual property offices;
- private companies specialised in technology transfer;
- as well as independent technology transfer professionals.

**Prerequisites:**

Basic knowledge of intellectual property law and of technology transfer.

**Entrance requirements:**

Participation of civil servants and staff members of certain public organisations shall be validated by WIPO Academy in the framework of its Professional Development Programme.

**Learning objectives:**

This training has as its objective deepening and update of knowledge on technology transfer.

**Knowledge to be acquired:**

At the end of the training course, the participants will have acquired new knowledge about:

- different mechanisms of technology transfer and intellectual property management;
- practices of organisation and negotiation of licences;
- particularities of technology transfer in the medical domain.

**Content:**

The content of the training course is determined by its learning objectives and knowledge to be acquired. The programme of every year is partially modified in order to take into account new practices and knowledge in technology transfer.

The classes notably cover:

- the role of intellectual property in technology transfer;
- management of intellectual property assets and licensing;
- public-private cooperation in technology transfer;
- particularities of technology transfer for public research centres, SMEs and large companies;
- particularities of technology transfer in the medical domain;
- international technology transfer, international intellectual property law and development;
- negotiation and drafting of technology transfer licences;
- open innovation and intellectual property;
- functioning of technology transfer offices;
- case studies and sharing of success stories.

**Duration:** 5 and/or 10 days (Saturday and Sunday are days off)

**Hours (indicative):** 9:30am-10:00am start; 3:30-4:00pm end

**Language:** English

**Speakers:**

The classes are given by experts and practitioners in technology transfer from different countries.

**Technical and pedagogical frame:**

- Access to the online session will take place via the connection to a distance-learning platform. The ID and password for the connection will be made available to the participant in advance.
- The online session contains the presentation of the CEIPI model solution to the mock papers and a question-answer part.
- The participant must have appropriate technical equipment to participate in the online session, in particular a laptop or similar device and high speed WIFI.

**Learning methods:**

Presentations, discussions and exchanges of experiences, case studies, group work.

Learning materials are shared through our Seafire platform.

The training course is exclusively offered online for WEEK 1 and offline for WEEK 2.
