Title of the training

Update Sessions on the Unified Patent Jurisdiction (UPC).

Public concerned and prerequisites

The programme is open to former participants of the CEIPI university diploma "Patent Litigation in Europe", Patent Attorneys as well as Attorneys at Law and other intellectual property Professionals with an interest in patent litigation and enforcement.

A good knowledge of the European Patent Convention and related issues by the participants is a prerequisite

Access conditions / Admission procedure

This is a non-degree training course.

Teaching objectives

The programme provides participants with the opportunity to learn about the latest developments and preparations for the establishment of the Unified Patent Court and the Unitary Patent. Through the content, participants will get an understanding of the institutional functioning of the UPC, the rules of procedure as well as the remedies available to the parties. Participants will also have the opportunity to meet the main stakeholders influencing the normative and implementation process of the UPC.

Programme

- Module 1 (23-24/02/2024 from 9am to 4pm for both dates including one hour lunch break). The Unified Patent Jurisdiction: updating, functioning and litigation (I)
- Module 2 (22-23/03/2024 from 9am to 4pm and from 9am to 3pm including one hour lunch break). The Unified Patent Jurisdiction: functioning and litigation (II)
- Module 3 (19-20/04/2024 9am to 5pm and from 9am to 3pm including one hour lunch break). The Unified Patent Jurisdiction: functioning and litigation (III)

- The UPC in the broader context of European law and the relationship between the UPC and the Court of Justice of the European Union
- The technical judges of the UPC interaction between legally qualified and technically qualified judges

- Rules of Procedure of the UPC
- The award of damages in the UPC Agreement
- The scope of protection conferred by a patent in light of the UPC Agreement and the European Patent Convention
- UPC Order to Preserve Evidence and Order for Inspection

This seminar is composed of 3 modules of 2 days each: a Friday and a Saturday in February, March and April. The total training hours for the course are 35 hours.
